And, Muslim women who feel they are violating Islam's teachings by using skin creams containing alcohol and pig residues have an alternative.

Layla Mandi claims she has developed religiously-correct "halaal" cosmetics.

Mandi is a Muslim Canadian make-up artist.

She is marketing cosmetics called OnePure, which she says have the luxury of international brands without the impure elements banned under Islamic law.

According to Mandi, there are fatty acids and gelatin used in moisturisers, shampoos, face masks and lipsticks, from pigs.

Said to be the first halaal cosmetics brand in the Middle East, OnePure is apparently certified in Malaysia by an Islamic body that also certifies meat and other consumer goods for Muslims.
